# Overview of Youth Empowerment Strategies for Success (YESS) (formerly Mega-network Continuum of Care/YESS)

**Description of the Organization.** YESS is a collaborative of organizations that focuses on improving quality of life for East Palo Alto (EPA) youth and their families. It has a bi-partite structure comprised of a <u>Policy Group</u> that governs, sets direction and oversees progress of the collaborative and a Direct Services Group that implements service provision initiatives.

YESS was initially formed as a result of an agreement established between the East Palo Alto Crime Reduction Task Force and the former East Palo Alto Youth and Young Adults Serving Agencies Consortium (both of which have been convened by One East Palo Alto [OEPA] since 2005 and 2004, respectively) to come together and work strategically on improving service provision in ways that ensure that EPA youth and young adults ages 14 to 24 develop all of the assets needed to realize their full potential.

YESS' overall aim is to create a formal mechanism by which different organizations that work in EPA's youth service arena can become more proactive and systems change- oriented with a view to accomplishing the following: (1) become a network of collaborating entities; (2) work to create specific goals for initiatives to be undertaken; (3) develop memoranda of understanding governing commitments, including collaborative fundraising; (4) bring concerns about youth and identified gaps in services to the fore, and (5) address service gaps in a collaborative way so as to frame the service provision work being done.

**Vision of YESS.** East Palo Alto youth and young adults are connected to resources and supports that maximize personal development.

**Mission of YESS.** The mission of YESS is currently in development. Its articulation will be guided by the following values adopted by the group: collaboration, accountability, youth/young adult-focused, inclusiveness, continuous improvement, sustainability and outcomes driven.

YESS Membership. Currently, YESS has attracted 36 member organizations. These include four (4) institutional entities – East Palo Alto Police Department, Ravenswood City School District, San Mateo County (Office of Supervisor Warren Slocum) and Sequoia Union High School District – and 32 local nonprofits

Services and Activities Provided. Each year, YESS adopts a work plan of priority services and activities to be conducted that will accomplish the following strategic goals adopted by the collaborative: promote asset development in youth programs; share information and resources; create and implement a community- wide youth plan, and link the YESS network with local, state and national funding initiatives. Priority initiatives for the 2013- 2014 fiscal year (July 1 through June 30) are as follows: (1) Youth Engagement and Youth Development – Strengthen services, supports and opportunities for and with youth and work with youth to achieve YESS goals; (2) Parent/Family Engagement – Build a collaborative family-school-community partnership that will enhance student learning and achievement by emphasizing the importance of social, emotional, and intellectual learning and development; (3) Data to Action (Data Linking and Use) – Use data and data linking to improve programs, practices and policies for youth; Fundraising to Support Joint Activities – Resource development to support YESS goals and priorities.

Brief Description of What the YESS Membership Contribution Will Go Toward. Institutional and nonprofit membership contributions to the YESS, \$5,000 and \$50 respectively, go toward supporting the collaborative's ongoing operations. More specifically, the contributions help cover annual costs of staff support for planning, convening and documenting regular meetings; purchasing materials and supplies for meetings and special events; funding Internet-based and other group-wide communications and conducting assessments and other evaluative procedures.

# AGREEMENT FOR CONFIDENTIAL DATA EXCHANGE BETWEEN GENERIC COMMUNITY-BASED ORGANIZATION (CBO) AND THE JOHN W. GARDNER CENTER FOR YOUTH AND THEIR COMMUNITIES at STANFORD UNIVERSITY

This Data Exchange and Confidentiality Agreement ("Agreement") between Generic Community-based Organization (hereinafter referred to as GENERIC CBO), The Board of Trustees of the Leland Stanford Junior University by and through its John W. Gardner Center for Youth and Their Communities (hereinafter referred to as JGC) describes the means to be used by JGC to ensure the confidentiality and security of information and data exchanged between GENERIC CBO and JGC for the purposes stated below.

#### I. GENERAL TERMS

#### A. PURPOSE

The JGC has developed the Youth Data Archive (YDA), an archive of matched longitudinal administrative data for conducting policy analyses for County leaders and practitioners. Policy questions to be addressed using the YDA will be developed in collaboration with participating public agencies and representatives of local community-based organizations. To ensure that the YDA is a valuable resource for all agencies contributing data, the project may also work with GENERIC CBO to identify one or more additional research questions that will be included in the project scope on behalf of GENERIC CBO.

#### **B. NATURE OF DATA**

To further the achievement of the above stated purpose, GENERIC CBO will at its discretion provide JGC with data extracts from the GENERIC CBO data systems to include data elements identified in **Attachment A**, as well as any additional items required to answer research questions defined by GENERIC CBO alone or with other participants in the YDA.

These data extracts will include historical information wherever possible. Additional data elements may be provided at the discretion of GENERIC CBO.

Because the YDA will match individual student level data, these data are expected to contain confidential information, the disclosure of which is restricted by a provision of law. Some examples of "confidential information" include, but are not limited to, "personal information" about individuals as defined in California Civil Code Section 1798.3 of the Information Practices Act and "personal information" about students as defined by the Code of Federal Regulations CFR Title 34 Volume 1 Part 99.3.

#### C. TRANSFER OF DATA

GENERIC CBO and JGC shall use a secure, mutually agreed upon means and schedule for transferring confidential information. GENERIC CBO will create data extracts and validate the data. Extracts will be updated using a mutually agreed upon schedule. At no time will data be sent electronically to or from the parties.

#### D. PERIOD OF AGREEMENT

This Agreement shall be effective per specifications in **Attachment B**, unless terminated earlier by either party pursuant to Section F.

#### E. JGC RESPONSIBILITIES

JGC agrees to the following confidentiality statements:

- 1. JGC acknowledges that these data are confidential data and proprietary to GENERIC CBO, and agree to protect such information from unauthorized disclosures and comply with all applicable confidentiality laws including but not limited to, the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA), the California Education Code and the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) as set forth in this agreement. JGC is responsible for complying with all District, Local, State and Federal confidentiality applicable laws and regulations.
- 2. JGC will use appropriate safeguards to prevent the use or disclosure of the information other than as provided by this data use Agreement.
- 3. JGC shall (a) instruct all staff with access to confidential information about the requirements for handling confidential information (b) provide all staff with access to confidential information statements of organizational policies and procedures for the protection of human subjects and data confidentiality and (c) notify staff of the sanctions against unauthorized disclosure or use of confidential and private information. JGC will ensure that all staff and subcontractors to whom they provide the limited data sets obtained under this Agreement, agrees to the same restrictions and conditions that apply to JGC in this Agreement with respect to such information. Other than as provided herein, no confidential data will be released by JGC.
- 4. JGC shall not assign this Agreement or any portion thereof to a third party without the prior written consent of GENERIC CBO, and any attempted assignment without such prior written consent in violation of this Section shall automatically terminate this Agreement.
- 5. JGC will use any information which could potentially allow the identification of any individual only for the purpose of creating the data sets using aggregate data and analyzing the data. JGC will not use or further disclose the information accessed or received other than as permitted by this Data Use Agreement or as otherwise required by law. Information which could potentially identify any individuals will be maintained in a separate data set and used only to create and update the linked data archive.
- 6. JGC will report only aggregate data and will not report any individual data, nor will data be reported in a manner that permits indirect identification of any individual. This paragraph will survive the termination of this Agreement.
- 7. JGC will not contact the individuals included in the data sets.
- 8. JGC agrees to obtain written approval from GENERIC CBO prior to engaging any subcontractors to perform any services requiring access to any individually identifiable information.

- 9. JGC shall not re-disclose any individual-level data with or without identifying information to any other requesting individuals, agencies, or organizations without prior written authorization by GENERIC CBO
- 10. JGC shall use the data only for the purpose stated above. These data shall not be used for personal gain or profit.
- 11. JGC shall keep all information furnished by GENERIC CBO in a space physically and electronically secure from unauthorized access. Information and data shall be stored and processed in a way that unauthorized persons cannot retrieve nor alter the information by means of a computer, remote terminal, or other means. No data will be stored on laptop computers or other portable computing devices or media, e.g., flash drives, etc.
- 12. JGC shall permit examination and on-site inspections by GENERIC CBO upon reasonable advance notice for the purpose of ascertaining whether the terms of this Agreement are being met.

#### F. TERMINATION

- 1. This Agreement may be terminated as follows, after notification via the United States Postal Service (certified mail or registered mail) or recognized overnight delivery service (e.g., UPS, DHL or FedEx):
  - a. By JGC or GENERIC CBO immediately in the event of a material breach of this Agreement by the other party.
  - b. By JGC or GENERIC CBO upon 30 days' notice to the other party.
- 2. At the termination of this Agreement or upon written request of GENERIC CBO, whichever is earlier, JGC shall return all confidential and/or sensitive information promptly and destroy all copies or derivations of the confidential and/or sensitive information utilizing an approved method of confidential destruction, including shredding, burning or certified/witnessed destruction for physical materials and verified erasure of magnetic media using approved methods of electronic file destruction.

#### G. GENERAL UNDERSTANDING

- 1. This Agreement contains the entire understanding of the parties and may only be amended in writing signed by the parties.
- 2. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed under the laws of the State of California.
- 3. Any waiver by any party of the violation of any provision of this Agreement shall not bar any action for subsequent violations of the Agreement.
